# Weekend Meal Program:

Distribution Volunteers are at the center of what we do! This role includes training and ongoing guidance.

- Must be 18+ and lift up to 35 lbs.
- Discreetly place food bags directly in lockers or backpacks
- Dedicate 1-2 hours on Thursday or Friday while children are in school

<u>May</u>: Volunteers are needed to coordinate and promote a STEP food drive to prepare for the highest-demand months.


